WHEREAS, the Housing option (HSG) has been an option in the Bachelor Degree in Apparel, Housing, and Resource Management for many years and the Major in Residential Environments and Design incorporates the courses and focus of the HSG option; and

WHEREAS, enrollment in the Housing option has been strong and students have been in demand for jobs in the private sector and been successful in jobs in the non-profit and/or governmental sector and in being accepted into graduate schools; and

WHEREAS, the title Residential Environments and Design is recognizable and understandable to high school and college students seeking a program related to the housing and residential design; and

WHEREAS, a major in Residential Environments and Design will be more readily promoted to potential employers and make it easier for students to market themselves; and

WHEREAS, the major in Residential Environments and Design will provide better visibility for the housing program and will provide support to the enrollment management of incoming freshmen and transfer students into the College of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences.
