1. Welcome and Introductions

Judith Shrum welcomed members to the meeting. Self-introductions were made.

2. Agenda Approval

The agenda was approved as presented.

3. Approval of Minutes, May 5, 2005

The May 5, 2005 Minutes were approved electronically and have been forwarded to University Council for approval.

4. Chairman's Report

Judith Shrum recapped 2004-05 accomplishments:

- The COIA membership was changed to reflect the re-organization of the Office of Outreach and International Affairs. The position which represented international programs and was appointed by the President was changed to a position that represents the University Council on International Affairs: The chair of the UCIA is Jack Davis. The chair of the UCIA is appointed by the Vice Provost for Outreach and International Affairs. The other branch within Outreach and International Affairs is the Outreach Council and is comprised of deans and other outreach agencies across the university.
- The COIA focused on three strategies last year:
 - Faculty award winners were brought in to share how they integrated scholarship with their research and how they engaged the community with their research. Those invited were LuAnn Gaskill, Gary Long, Heike Mayer and Joe Scarpaci.
 - Worked with the Provost to establish a dialogue across the campus to try to change the culture at Virginia Tech so that the scholarship of outreach would be recognized and rewarded in the promotion and tenure process. The Outreach NOW event is the result of those discussions.
 - Changing the P&T document. The P&T sub-committee consisted of Judi Lynch, Mike Lambur, Gary Long, Jack Davis, Ken Eriksson, and Pat Sobrero. This committee gave recommendations to the Provost for changing the P&T document. Changes are reflected in the P&T document. There was discussion on the changes, and Ken Eriksson read from page 4 of the P&T document about the change in the definition of scholarship: "Scholarship, which is pervasive across all three mission of the university, is broadly defined at Virginia Tech as the creation of knowledge that is peer reviewed and publicly disseminated."
- Outreach and International alumni award winners were selected and will be recognized at the September 28 event.
- Ralph Byers was invited to discuss the implications of the new restructuring of higher education legislation and what it means for outreach but was unable to attend last year.
- Outreach Council reports to the COIA, and listed are last year's accomplishments as reported from Outreach Council:
 - Ralph Stanley Music Museum; Philpott Manufacturing; Sloan Industrial Center on Wood Products; The Inn at Virginia Tech and Skelton Conference Center was established; Technology Transfer and Economic Development, developing patents and assisting faculty with Intellectual Properties at Virginia Tech; Economic Developers showcase on November 3 and 4; The Outreach and International Affairs magazine was established; Business After Hours Conference directed by Susan Short was held at the Virginia Tech Roanoke Center; the Virginia Tech Roanoke Center is

working with the English Language Institute and the College of Human Resources and Education on English as a Second Language programs for students.

- University Council on International Affairs reports to the COIA, and listed are last year's accomplishments as reported from the UCIA:
 - The International Strategic Directions Team, led by S. K. De Datta, developed a university-wide international strategic plan; the presidents of the ACC established some grant possibilities and some ways that people can showcase their work; an FDI event was conducted where faculty members from Virginia Tech competed to be able to attend at the CESA Center and their charge was to establish some research relationships with other universities; began work on establishing the Biodiversity Center at Punta Cana; connections were established with Monterrey Tech in student personnel and engineering; an inventory of study abroad programs, which are available on the web; an international link on the Virginia Tech homepage; established some connections with the State of Virginia that was asking for competitive bidding on tours and study abroad programs; successful through the leadership of S. K. De Datta in receiving a number of federal grants which were outstanding; \$34M in grants received in OIRED.

5. Action Items

- Outreach NOW

Jeri Childers lead a discussion on the Outreach NOW 2005 event to be held on September 28. She reported that the event will begin at 1:30 p.m. and Dr. Martin Jischke, president of Purdue University will be the guest speaker. There is a target audience of 200 people. Susan Felker reviewed information pertaining to exhibits for this event. The evaluation for the event will be available online, and will be sent to participants immediately following the event. A web site containing electronic proceedings, Dr. Jischke's speech and other documents will be set up immediately following this conference. This web site will be utilized next year for marketing purposes for Outreach NOW 2006. There was discussion on how to assist Dr. Childers with the evaluation process. The COIA was invited to this event and was asked to register. Dr. Childers will send a request to Dr. McNamee to invite deans to participate in this event.

1. Welcome and Introductions

Judith Shrum welcomed members to the meeting. Self-introductions were made.

2. Agenda Approval

The agenda was approved as presented.

3. Approval of Minutes, September 8, 2005

The September 8, 2005 Minutes were approved electronically and have been forwarded to University Council for approval.

4. Chairman's Report

Judith Shrum praised the Outreach NOW plenary and panel. She said that the guest speaker, Dr. Martin Jischke gave a language, inspiration, and rationale for doing much of what is being done and for continuing with the goals and reaching to newer heights in doing scholarship of engagement at Virginia Tech. The exhibits were a good opportunity to network with those who are active in outreach and international scholarship. This year's goals will be to look at the outcomes of the Outreach NOW conference and to invite Ralph Byers to talk about the impact of recent legislation restructuring higher education.

5. Vice-Chairman's Report

Ken Eriksson gave a report from the September 19 University Council meeting.

6. Action Items

- Jeri Childers shared partial data information from the Outreach NOW 2005 conference.
 - Good comments from faculty and staff for the overall conference.
 - Statistics:
 - 253 people registered for this first-time conference; 196 attended
 - The registration list (sorted by college) was shared with members
 - All 8 colleges were represented as well as 40 departments; the Library sent a contingent of people.
 - 21 exhibitors – Very good feedback about the quality and quantity of exhibits.
 - As of October 12 there were 74 responses from the electronic survey. Feedback was discussed.
 - The speaker was ranked 4.8 (scale of 5)
 - Content ranking 4.7 (scale of 5)
 - Dr. Jischke's remarks can be found on the web site: <http://www.conted.vt.edu/outreachnow/>
- Scott Baker suggested that extension could be included to play a role with faculty in outreach.

- Judith Shrum will contact the panel speakers to ask permission to share their presentations on the web site.
- Commission members felt that a yet stronger understanding of the scholarship of engagement is needed, with emphasis on how to document the impact of the scholarship.
- Discussion of next steps:
 - The Commission voted to hold the conference again next year in late September and then annually.
 - A panelist to speak about international outreach and how their scholarship activity relates to that arena;
 - Invite a high profile person again.
 - Structure/strategy of the event, timing and space for the event needs to be identified by the next meeting since the IVTSCC is now high profile and it is harder to schedule space.
 - The second week of November is international week. It was suggested that during that week a high profile international scholar could be invited to talk about their international activity to help faculty look at linkages as it relates to their international activity and their scholarly activity.
 - A question was raised about what can be done to improve the understanding on campus of outreach scholarship, and what can be done to publicize the nature of outreach scholarship between now and the next conference. The Commission explored the ideas of reviewing departmental and college policies regarding outreach and ways to communicate with faculty members serving on the P&T committees.
 - Hispanic Awareness Month is in October, and this could be a time to combine our conference with international efforts already being held.
 - This discussion will continue at the next meeting to bring together these suggestions for next year and how to connect with the P&T committees this year by possibly inviting those P&T chairs to meet with the COIA before their next meeting. It was also suggested that a workshop could be held for P&T committees in the spring.

It was suggested that each member find a measure of outreach that might exist within their field of area that is represented on the COIA and share at the next meeting.

It was also suggested that a case study approach would be a good way to look at this instead of something presented in the “abstract.”

- There are two areas that need attention in outreach:
 - Helping people to identify impact.
 - Look creatively at how we engage others in peer review to look at best practices.
- Handouts of information were shared from the Clearing House and National Review Board for the Scholarship of Engagement that conducts reviews for faculty. This will also be shared electronically.
- Juried presentations could be sponsored at the Outreach NOW 2006 conference where faculty can demonstrate those presentations on their P&T documents.
- Valerie Hardcastle will share a case study for the College of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences at an upcoming Commission meeting. A committee of faculty will be working with other faculty in her college to look at how the college will communicate, quantify, and evaluate

outreach efforts. Judith Shrum will invite her to come to a future meeting. The case study stemmed from the Outreach NOW 2005 conference.

Glenda Scales reported on milestones from the subcommittee on the Outreach NOW 2006 conference.

- The keynote speaker needs to be either a major university person that understands the direction of engagement or a person from a major funding agency. There was discussion and examples shared of potential speakers. A keynote speaker needs to be identified quickly in order to ensure their participation.
 - The following were proposed as the top speakers:
 - William C. Richardson, President and CEO of the W. K. Kellogg Foundation
 - The Howard Hughes Medical Institute
 - Peter McGrath, retired past president of NASULGC
 - Congressman Rick Boucher

William Richardson was selected as the keynote speaker. The official invitation will be sent from President Steger. The subcommittee will contact back-ups if needed.

2. Agenda Approval

The agenda was approved as presented.

3. Approval of Minutes, December 8, 2005

The December 8, 2005 Minutes were approved electronically and have been forwarded to University Council for approval.

4. Chairman's Report

At the February 9 COIA meeting, Valerie Hardcastle will give a presentation of how the College of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences is presenting the OIA activities of their faculty.

Ralph Byers will attend the April 13 COIA meeting to discuss the effect of the restructuring of higher education (Charter University) and the implications for OIA.

Upcoming meetings are: February 9, March 16, April 13, and May 11.

This is the year of study abroad, which is a congressional proclamation.

5. Vice-Chairman's Report

The College of Science now has an outreach committee. Ken Eriksson is on the college committee and will represent COIA. The first meeting will be within the next two weeks.

He reported on outcomes from the January 17 Faculty Senate meeting.

6. Action Items

There was continued discussion on measures of outreach/scholarship of engagement from Commission members.

There was discussion from the materials that Judith Shrum sent out electronically from the Driscoll and Lynton book, Making Outreach Visible: A Guide to Documenting Professional Service and Outreach. This was a major national project in which faculty from top 30 major research universities were brought together to look at models to make outreach visible. These models may be used at the Outreach NOW 2006 workshops.

Awards description

Ken Eriksson described the three awards in outreach:

- Alumni Award for Outreach Excellence (individual)
 - \$2,000 award and a plaque
- Alumni Award for Outreach Excellence (team)
 - \$2,000 shared award with team and a plaque
- College Awards for Outreach Excellence (8 college awards – individual or team)
 - \$500 per award and a plaque

When the awards announcement is sent to colleges this year, it will be modified to include a paragraph to state that college awards are funded by the Vice Provost for Outreach and International Affairs and the program is managed by the Commission on Outreach and International Affairs. Susan Felker will notify college public relations personnel of the correct wording for their press releases.

The deadline to submit nominations will be set for Monday, March 20. Judith Shrum will send out to members of the Commission the language for the nominations for this year, and she asked for feedback by January 24. Ken Eriksson will prepare the call for nominations that will go out to the DDD list.

The Academy for Outreach Excellence needs to be better displayed of those who have received alumni awards. It was suggested that last year's recipients be added to the awards announcement.

Appointing Awards Committee

An awards committee was selected for the Alumni Awards for Outreach Excellence: Ken Eriksson, and Jeri Childers. Leon Geyer, last year's award recipient will be asked to serve on the committee. If others are interested, they need to contact Ken Eriksson.

International awards are administered by the University Council for International Affairs (UCIA).

- Alumni Award for Excellence in International Education (individual)
- Alumni Award for Excellence in International Outreach and Research (individual)

These announcements will be sent out at the same time, and there will be an April deadline. UCIA will select an awards committee. A past awards recipient will be added to the awards committee.

Report from the Sub-Committee on Outreach NOW 2006

Jeri Childers distributed and discussed an update on the plans for the fall conference. The date has been chosen as Wednesday, September 27. The proposed design will start with a pre-conference workshop targeted to a small group of 30 participants. The conference will begin again this year after lunch and end at 6:00 p.m. after a reception. The invited keynote speaker is Mr. Sterling Speirn, President and CEO of the Kellogg Foundation. The target audience will be 250 with 35 exhibits/posters. The Commission supported break-out sessions. It was decided that undergraduate and graduate student work will be accommodated for the exhibits/posters. It was suggested that the pre-conference workshop be specifically targeted for P&T members or deans or whoever is managing the selection process with 4-5 people from each college. It was suggested that additional workshops could be held at times throughout the year when P&T committees are meeting.

Mike Barnett reported they have not met their numbers for attendance for high school students, but they are visiting schools to recruit attendance. The conference is scheduled on March 17-19, 2006.

4. Chairman's Report

Dr. Shrum reported from the University Council meeting on February 6.

A draft handout was distributed on the Engagement strategy of the university plan, which contained the goal, definition and four strategies. The language from Dr. Martin Jischke's speech is included in this draft from Outreach NOW 2005. The Provost has convened a university-wide task force to look at the university's strategic plan. The major program components of the strategic plan will be built around the domains of learning, discovery and engagement. A subcommittee of the task force is looking at the engagement language and is being shared with different audiences for input. Feedback is welcome from COIA. The final draft will be shared with the BOV the end of March.

5. Vice-Chairman's Report

Ken Eriksson reported from the outreach committee of the College of Science, which met today for the first time. Their next meeting will be on a discussion of the P&T guidelines that should lead in to revisions of the faculty activity reports in that college.

The announcement of the alumni and college awards for outreach excellence has been sent out to the university community. A copy of the announcement will be forwarded to the COIA. The awards

subcommittee is Ken Eriksson, chair; Jeri Childers; Jennifer Abel; Susan Hagen; and Leon Geyer. Nominations are due March 20.
