Graduate Course Prerequisites: The committee discussed the rationale for the minimum prerequisite for a graduate course being "Graduate standing" rather than an undergraduate course. Because undergraduate courses cannot be taken for graduate credit and the number of undergraduate course credits on a plan of study is limited to 6, it is better for faculty to use advising and mentoring to assure students have appropriate preparation for graduate courses rather than specifying 4000-level courses as prerequisites.
