3. Presentation

Kristina Cook (Sustainability Program Coordinator, Office of Sustainability), Nick Quint (Transportation Network Manager, Sustainable Transportation), Teresa Sweeney (Campus Waste and Recycling Manager, Facilities Operations), Jack Leff (Climate Fellow, Office of Sustainability), Simona Fried (Manager of Energy Projects and Analytics, Office of Energy Management) gave presentations that covered all agenda items for the committee meeting (attached).

4. Open Discussion and Announcements

- Zero Waste: VT is registered for "Race to Zero Waste" challenge. Emily Williams led the effort for an instructional for students to use the compactor. You will see labels appearing on waste receptacles on campus (simplify message to reduce contamination). Gathering information for monthly reports
- Climate Action Living Laboratory: Had two meetings this semester to finalize the plan for updating the CALL website as well as formalizing the intake structure and distribution system. CALL sign-up link open to all faculty, staff, and students: https://virginiatech.questionpro.com/CALL2023-2024. There will be VT News article about the CALL in next couple weeks
- Climate Justice: No meeting yet because waiting on some RFP information. Rally in front of Burruss.
- Sustainable Blacksburg: Next Lunch and Learn Wednesday, October 25th "Save Money and Energy with New Climate Incentives". No meetings in November and December. Will reconvene in January.
- Todd Shenk: If I understand, we're woefully behind on meeting our GHG emissions targets. What is being done and what should be being done collectively to change course significantly to address that issue?
 - o Nam Nguyen:
 - In our purchase of electricity, we're looking at incorporating renewables into the portfolio (solar PPA and/or a wind PPA) into our purchase of electricity
 - We can't do that until our current contract with AEP expires in 2027
 - Multi-year process

- Looking forward to reducing scope 2 emissions that way
- Stopped using coal since 2020. 2 years ahead of commitment to stop using coal by 2025
- Looking at the potential to incorporate hydrogen into the fuel mix
- We have to balance with affordability goal from President Sands
- Nathan King: all subcommittees and all involved please consider the 2025 CAC revisions. We'll need to pull information together during 2024.
 - Nam Nguyen: VTES is working with Facilities Operations to add 1.4 MW of solar rooftop on campus

Update:

The SCCSEC subcommittee met on 13th September. Since we had new members join us this Fall, more attention was paid to the goals of the subcommittee and a quick update on the achievements of the previous academic year. The subcommittee will be carrying forward the action points discussed in the Spring, namely - i) Initiate paperless campus by reaching out to different colleges and ii) continue to build momentum on Green Office and Green Lab Certification Programs. As part of revamping the Green Labs Certification program, the survey questionnaire has been modified and will be rolled out by the end of Fall. Members of the subcommittee as well as that of the Sustainable Labs group contributed two months of effort into researching similar programs at other Virginia universities, simplifying the survey questionnaire, reaching out to Pls/Grad students for their comments and more. The subcommittee will continue to ramp up efforts to engage students, faculty and staff in moving forward with the creation of a culture that aids sustainable choices in all labs around campus.






VT Urban Forestry Advisory Committee

Update:

- The name of the committee is new (used to be the Arboretum Committee)
- There will be an Urban Forestry presentation to the BOV at their November meeting
- VT did not receive the IRA grant but the workforce development program submitted is still applicable and VDOF has interest in pursuing funds for the project.
- ICU: Many trees receiving ongoing care are doing well
- The Urban Forestry Team will be reducing the scope and inventory of planting projects until maintenance is funded
- Old Growth Forest: Risk mitigation plan successfully completed. A planting day has been chosen for a commemorative tree for John Ford: October 22, 2023. ACF has promised a genetically engineered chestnut to plant for Carl Absher: planting date TBD
- International Peace Garden: The name will remain. Space will be renovated to reduce weed pressure and return the site to a more sustainable state. Commemorative tree plantings will be targeted to the site.
- Urban Community Forestry Assistance Grant: The Urban Forestry Team is partnering with Dave Carter and John Seiler to file a grant this fall for planting, white regeneration, reforestation in the Old-Growth Forest, and legacy tree propagation across campus.










- SB awarded 3 mini grants: Big Plant (\$500), Sunset Blvd (\$300), Foraging zine (\$200)

 - November 10th-11th YMCA Craft Fair- sustainable gift wrapping and cutlery sets






Update:

- \$1 million HVAC retro commissioning project underway for 13 buildings. The year long project is expected to reduce campus energy usage by 3.5%
- \$1 million LED lighting upgrades are underway across numerous buildings. The year long process is expected to reduce campus energy usage by nearly 1%
- Working through an Energy Savings Performance Contracting process with investment grade energy auditing anticipated across FY24

- Expanding occupancy-based temperature and ventilation control program
