- The Cabinet authorized the Commission on Faculty Affairs (CFA) to begin drafting a resolution to amend the Faculty Handbook to codify the grievance process. This authorization will satisfy the requirement for a resolution proposal approval.
- The CFA will consult with the Commission on Administrative and Professional Faculty Affairs and the Commission on Graduate and Professional Studies and Policies to ensure all classifications of faculty are included in the revisions to the Faculty Handbook.
- CFA will loop in the Commission on Staff Policies and Affairs to determine if a resolution is needed from the staff side or if they can rely on existing HR/DHRM procedures.
- The Commission on Graduate and Professional Student Affairs will partner with the Graduate School to develop and pilot training modules for graduate student panel members.

• CFA will confirm handbook placement for the graduate and professional student panelist requirement and will ensure complementary language with Policy 6125.
